

How is the allocation done?

After a rough classification when booking, the children receive a suitable ski school bib in the corresponding colour at the start of the course. It is important that parents give an honest assessment when registering.

The finer allocation takes place at the start of the course when the children are brought forward directly on the slopes by our head ski instructors.

The classification is based on the following criteria:

- primarily on driving ability and experience, driving technique, speed, safety
- age of the children with a corresponding number of course participants
- native language as the last aspect, as this cannot always be planned for group courses

What levels are there?

- * Group 5 Green: beginners, first contact with skis.
- * Group 4 Blue: skiing on a flat slope.
- * Group 3 Red: Skiers who can ski on moderately difficult slopes.
- * Group 2 Yellow: Skiers who can ski on slopes of all levels of difficulty.
- * Group 1 Yellow: Skiers who can ski the most difficult slopes and terrain (moguls, deep snow, etc.) with confidence.

Please note that there are several subdivisions for each ability level!

Why is there a change of group?

Of course, we try to divide the children into groups according to their skiing ability right at the start of the course.

Sometimes, due to a longer 'ski break' or due to changed slope conditions (very soft snow, icy slopes, etc.), the children are sometimes not yet able to call up their actual ability compared to the previous year's course and need some time and practice to regain confidence in skiing. It can therefore happen that the grouping is not exactly right at the beginning and that there is a change of group in the first few days of the course - changes or a change of group are made as quickly as possible by our ski instructors. Homogeneous groups are very important to us, as they contribute significantly to the learning success of the whole group.

Can our children join the same group?

Yes, if the skiing ability and age are roughly the same. The success of the lesson and safety have priority. As the grouping in our ski school takes place on site at the assembly point, please inform the respective ski instructors of your wishes on the first day of the course. We will of course try to fulfil your wishes!

Please note that the child, who is the more accomplished skier, must show consideration for the weaker skier. The child who skis better may then not benefit from the course or become bored and may no longer enjoy the course.
